ALUMNI ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Alumni Association offers an academic scholarship to a Georgia resident who has a GPA of 2.5 –2.99 and is a sophomore, junior or senior in good standing. This scholarship is awarded to undergraduate students only.

DAPHNE CANTRELL CHAMBLESS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by Daphne Ann Chambless in honor of her mother, the Daphne Cantrell Chambless Award criteria is for a Georgia Southwestern State University student pursuing a baccalaureate degree in any academic subject, has a record of academic excellence as demonstrated by a GPA of 3.0 and has achieved a level of a Junior or Senior.

GENERAL ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

The General Scholarship Fund is an award for students with a SAT of 1000 and 3.0 GPA.

E. R. HOGG SCHOLARSHIP

The Hogg Scholarship award was established by the GSW Class of 1926 to honor their class president, Ernest R. Hogg. This award is given to assist a worthy student leader who has financial need, completes a minimum of 15 hours per semester, and maintains a 2.80 GPA.

HOLLOWAY SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

This scholarship cash award was established by Dr. Harold E. Holloway, a 1953 graduate of Schley County High School in Ellaville, Georgia. This award benefits Honor Graduates of Schley County High School who attend G SW. Awards are subject to availability of funds. Awarded by Schley County High School Counselor

JULIA BAKER ISAKSON SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by E.A. Isakson of Roswell, Georgia, to honor his wife Julia, a 1937 graduate of Georgia Southwestern College. This scholarship covers full tuition and is awarded to a deserving student with a positive attitude who would benefit from an education at GSW. It is renewable and not based on financial need.

PEYTON JACOB SCHOLARSHIP

The Alumni Association established this scholarship in honor of Peyton Jacob, President of GSW from '35 to '48, for worthy students of good academic standards. Selection is made by the Director of Financial Aid.

MATTIE H. MARSHALL FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

This memorial scholarship honors Mattie H. Marshall, mother of former Georgia Supreme Court Justice Tom Marshall, and is awarded to a worthy student who is a resident of the State of Georgia and has a minimum GPA of 2.5.

T. HARVEY MATHIS SCHOLARSHIP

Mrs. Elizabeth Cheatham, long time resident of Sumter County, established the T. Harvey Mathis Scholarship in memory of her father. This academic scholarship is available to deserving students who are residents of Sumter County with a minimum 3.0 GPA and show financial need.

MCMILLAN SCHOLARSHIPS

Frances Daniel, caregiver and friend of the late Kenneth (Tip) McMillan, GSW Class of 1959, shared his desire to assist students in obtaining higher education. She established two alumni endowed scholarships in his memory. Consideration is given to residents of the Ga. Sheriff's Youth Homes, or of Colquitt County, Ga., who have financial need and meet admission standards. Selection is by a Special Committee chaired by Rudolph Patterson, Attorney and awarded by Director of Financial Aid.

MARSHALL PRYOR SCHOLARSHIP

This endowed scholarship was established in memory of Robert Marshall Pryor by his family. The scholarship is available to residents of Sumter County, Georgia, who have financial need. Marshall Pryor, the grandson of the late Judge Thomas O. Marshall, Supreme Court Justice of the State of Georgia, demonstrated great courage in his fight to live and will always be an inspiration to his family and friends.

BLANCHE AND C.L. RHYNE SCHOLARSHIP

The family of Blanche S. Rhyne established this scholarship for a gifted student in any discipline.

LULA FINCH STEPHENS SCHOLARSHIP

This endowed scholarship award was established by Sam P. Stephens of Anderson, South Carolina, Class of 1942, in memory of his mother who was from Americus, Georgia, and sent four of her children to GSW. Criteria are based on need and is renewable.

JENNIE STRANGE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was the second endowed award established by alumnus Sam P. Stephens (1942), to honor his mother-in-law, Jennie Strange of Ellaville, Georgia. Criteria are based on financial needs of a deserving student. Scholarship is renewable.
