 - ULOs do not apply to graduate programs
 - Currently, these outcomes are largely aspirtational

UNIV 1000/INTL 1000

- Used World Café as Initiating Experience This Fall
 - Nine separate events
 - Students (both international and UNIV 1000) seemed to enjoy the experience
- Four W2W Events this Fall (INTL 1000)
 - Good News: 1221 attendees (duplicated headcount)
 - Bad News: 986 or 81% got credit for INTL 1000 (also duplicated headcount)
 - Still need to get the message out about survey completion for INTL 1000 credit

- INTL 3900 W2W Capstone
 - Students Completing
 - Spring 2017 = 14
 - Summer 2017 = 2
 - □ Fall 2017 = 26
 - Five graduating seniors
 - Three students from Fall 2016 cohort
 - Nine did not complete the capstone in Fall 2017

- INTL 1000 Progression
 - 2014 Cohort
 - Spring 2017 (2 or fewer) = 110
 - Fall 2017 (3 or fewer) = 97
 - 2015 Cohort
 - Spring 2017 (1 or fewer) = $\overline{184}$
 - Fall 2017 (2 or fewer) = 120
 - Will begin tracking the 2016 Cohort this spring
