PLACEMENT TESTING:

All students must take the Compass ESL examinations (reading, listening, writing/grammar), undergo an assessment of oral and written skills, and take the Compass English and Math examinations upon arrival at GSW.

Placement test results will determine the level at which the student begins the Certificate program.

If scores on Placement test fall below minimum required standards, students will be placed in remedial courses until competency improves.

Students who place at the Bridge level may receive credit for the Advanced level courses as deemed appropriate by the Program Director.

Program Completion:

In order to complete the program and earn the certificate, students must complete <u>all</u> of the following requirements <u>within one calendar year.</u>

- Earn a minimum of 19 semester hours of credit with a minimum grade of "C" in each course.
- Earn the appropriate scores on the Exit exams. Scores in all subject areas must be at or above the required level. See the ELI office for details.
- 3. Earn a minimum TOEFL score of 69/193/523 prior to the completion of the final exam period.
- Follow the certificate attendance policies and requirements as listed in the ELI handbook.
- An extension may be granted as long as the student continues to make satisfactory progress and adheres to ELI policies.

NOTES:

Admission into degree programs may require higher TOEFL scores.

Students should check admission policies at the institution(s) they plan to attend.
