PLACEMENT TESTING

All students must take the Compass ESL examinations (reading, listening, and writing/grammar), undergo an assessment of oral and written skills, and take the Compass English and Math examinations upon arrival at GSW.

Placement test results will determine the level at which the student begins the Certificate program.

If scores on Placement test fall below minimum required standards, students will be placed in remedial courses until competency improves.

Students who place at the Advanced level may receive credit for Intermediate level classes as deemed appropriate by the Program Director.

Program Completion

In order to complete the program and earn the certificate, students must complete all of the following requirements within one calendar year:

1. Earn a minimum of 19 semester hours of credit with a minimum grade of "C" in each course.
2. Earn the appropriate scores on the Exit exams. Scores in all subject areas must be at or above the required level. See the ELI office for details.
3. Earn a minimum TOEFL score of 65/183/513 prior to the completion of the final exam period.
4. Follow the Certificate attendance policies and requirements as listed in the ELI student handbook.
5. An extension can be granted so long as the student continues to make satisfactory progress and adheres to all policies.

NOTES:

Admission into degree programs may require higher TOEFL scores. Students should check admission policies at the institution(s) they plan to attend.

*ESPN courses are open only to students who plan a career in Nursing.
